



#### Fasting, Almsgiving, and Prayer

Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence (foregoing meat and meat products). The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards. (Norms from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops)

The point of abstinence is to help us focus on eating to live, and one its fruits is to use the money we would spend on ourselves to help others, and to thank God more intensely for the gifts we have received.
